This section has had a complete turn-over in enlisted personnel during the past six months. S Sgt Ben E Popwell, the NCOIC at the beginning of the period, was transferred overseas and was replaced by Sergeant Holford during the first week of March 1955.

During January and February, only two officers and two enlisted men were assigned for duty. The third airman was assigned during the first week of March. This brought the section up to strength except for one officer, for the first time since activation.

Airman Onimus is due for separation on 10 July 1955 and, as yet, no replacement is available. Major Gonterman requested a replacement

orders. This project was accomplished through the efforts and cooperation of all sections and divisions concerned.

The first step in accomplishing the project was to list all required and authorized llN series T.O.'s used by the entire Group. This was accomplished by 28 February 1955. Copies of this consolidated list were then distributed to the custodians of the various files with the request that they indicate their individual requirements.

It was determined that a minimum of ten files would be required, they were as follows:

ESO.....Central File
 ESQA.....Plant I
 ESOT.....Plant II
 ESQA-E.....Plant I Electrical Bay
 ESQA-M.....Plant I Mechanical Bay
 ESOP.....Plant Property
 ESOL.....Loading
 ESQH.....Handling
 ESON.....Nuclear Section
 ESO-TR.....Technical Repair

With a firm requirement established for the entire Group a new T.O. Distribution Requirements Table was submitted to SAAMA on 5 April 1955. This new table decreased our automatic distribution requirements from a straight six copies to three or four for several of the series.

All llN series technical orders were next called in and only

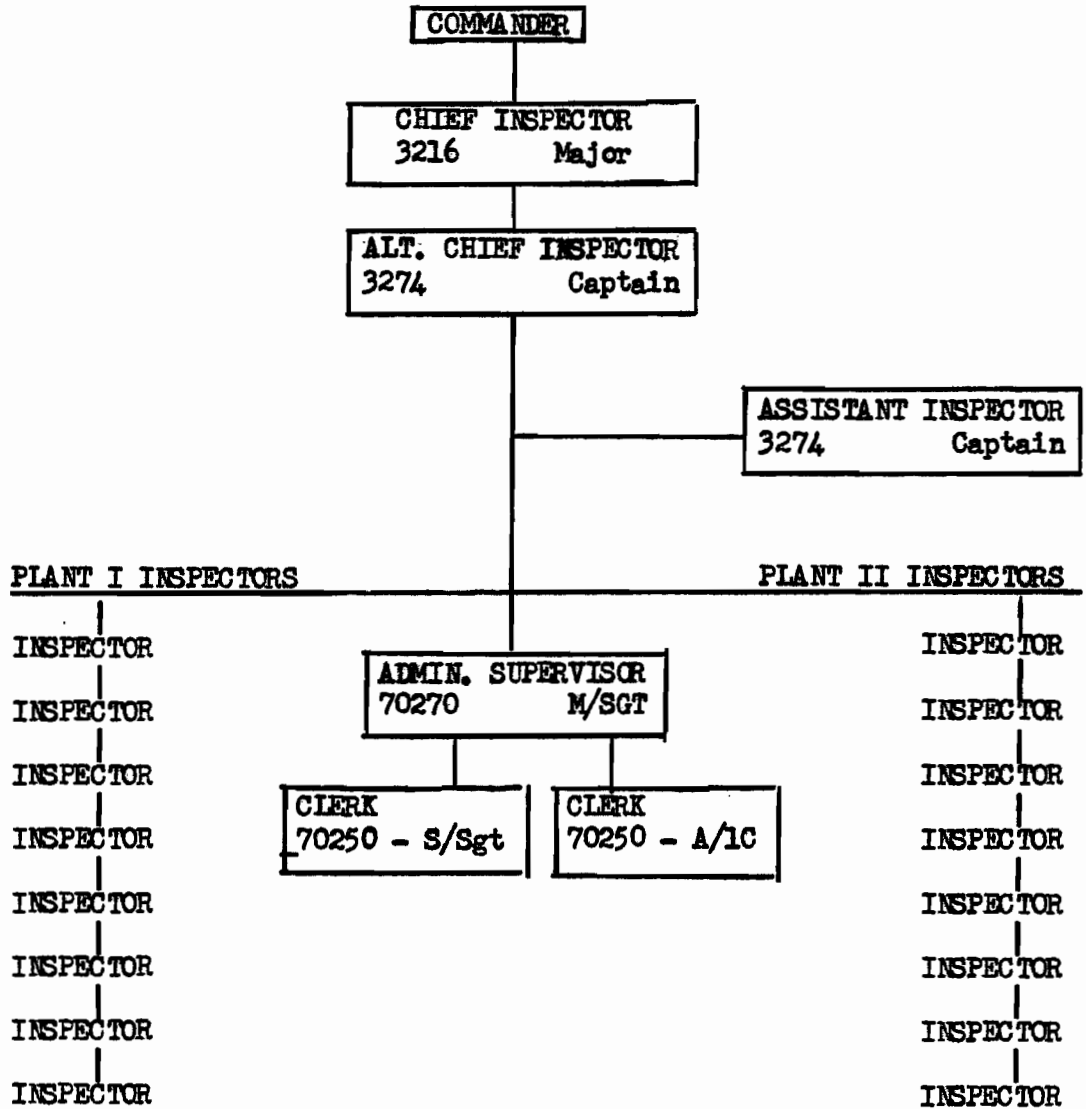
